CLEM7 TO BECOME KIM7 FOR A DAY

WHEN THE CLEM7 BECOMES THE KIM7 TUNNEL ON FRIDAY, 23 JULY 2010, DRIVE THROUGH AND HELP US RAISE \$100,000 FOR KIM WALTERS CHOICES.

We're changing the name of the tunnel for one special day as part of Think Pink, Think Choices Week. When you drive through the KIM7 Tunnel on Friday, 23 July 2010, not only will you experience the benefit of a faster journey, you'll also play an important role in helping those affected by cancer through their own journey to recovery.

On KIM7 day, we'll donate the total of your toll plus \$1 to the Brisbane-based charity set up in honour of Kim Walters. Our goal is to get behind a great cause with Brisbane motorists to raise \$100,000 – it's your chance to use the CLEM7 to get where you need to go faster, while doing your part to support a vital community service.

'Kim Walters Choices is a free community service providing information and support for women, men and their families affected by breast or gynaecological cancer,' said Linda Grieve, Fundraising Coordinator, Kim Walters Choices.

'Choices is funded and supported entirely through the generosity of the community.'

By motorists choosing to use the CLEM7 Tunnel while it's the KIM7 thousands of women, men and their families will gain the support they need on an ongoing basis while going through a very traumatic time,' said Linda.

Chief Executive Officer, Flan Cleary, said RiverCity Motorway was pleased to get behind the Kim Walters Choices program.

THE SAFEST WAY TO BYPASS BRISBANE'S CBD

You can be confident that the CLEM7 is the safest way to bypass the Brisbane CBD.

The tunnel is unique compared with most other surface roads and motorways because it is entirely controlled by the Tollway Control Centre 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If there is a break-down or incident, a range of safety systems kick into gear straight away, helping you to keep flowing where you need to go.

With access to more than 350 cameras, tunnel operators are immediately alerted to any change in traffic conditions inside the CLEM7. If there's a break-down operators are able to manage traffic flow, air quality and communication systems at the touch of a button.

The CLEM7 Incident Response Crew is on hand at all times, able to be quickly dispatched to attend to incidents. Tow-trucks and traffic management vehicles can be sent into the tunnel to assist motorists. In most cases break-downs are attended to within 5 minutes.

The CLEM7 is the widest tunnel of its type in Australia, with shoulders on each side of the lanes. This provides ample room for vehicles to pull over if necessary and wait for the CLEM7 Incident Response Crew.

The level of traffic control in the CLEM7 means traffic flow is able to be managed quickly and efficiently, which means an extra lane for break-downs and emergency access is not necessary.

NEW WAYS TO TRAVEL

The CLEM7 gives you more options to get where you need to go faster, while saving up to 20 minutes in travel time.

Motorists using the CLEM7 during peak periods usually save between 8 and 10 minutes. When a minor traffic incident occurs on surface roads, this time saving can be up to 20 minutes. With cars now paying only \$2 for a hassle-free journey, trust the CLEM7 to get you there sooner when you:

- Need to get from the inner western suburbs (eg. Kelvin Grove and Milton), to the inner eastern and southern suburbs (eg. Kangaroo Point and Coorparoo).
- Need to get to Brisbane Airport. With a direct connection to the Inner City Bypass, the CLEM7 is the fastest way to make the plane from East Brisbane, Woolloongabba and surrounds.
- Shop til you drop. Taking the CLEM7 means you can spend up to half an hour longer at Westfield Chermshire, DFO at Brisbane Airport and Westfield Garden City at Mt Gravatt.
- Head out to the races. The CLEM7 connects inner south and east-siders straight to Ascot, Eagle Farm and Doomben.
- Visit someone in hospital. The CLEM7 is an important link to some of Brisbane's major hospitals, including the Princess Alexandra, the Royal Brisbane & Women's, the Royal Children's, the Mater and St Vincent's Hospitals.

GET STRAIGHT TO IT FOR LESS

Brisbane has told us they love the CLEM7 and value the way it saves time, so we've made it even more affordable. From 1 July until 30 September 2010, motorists will drive their dollar even further when they use the CLEM7 for faster travel with new toll rates, now effective.

AIR IN THE CLEM7

With thousands of vehicles travelling through the CLEM7 every day, maintaining the quality of air is an important part of its day-to-day operations.

The CLEM7 operates within certain guidelines to ensure levels of vehicle emissions present in the air are controlled. These guidelines are set by the Queensland Co-ordinator General, and are based on standards recommended by the World Health Organisation.

The CLEM7 continues to operate well within these guidelines, which means emissions are being effectively managed.

More than 18 air quality monitors operate throughout the tunnel as part of its state-of-the-art ventilation system, as well as 4 air quality monitors located externally. Monitoring results are reported daily online.
